ח-א These two letters are very similar; the difference between them is that א has a small projection on the upper left-hand side, whereas ח does not.

ת-ח The left foot of the ח has a small projection at the bottom facing outward, whereas ת does not.

ע-ט In certain typefaces, these letters look very similar; they can be distinguished, however, by the fact that the ע has a projection on the outward facing left-hand side.

צ-ל The similarity between these two letters is apt to be particularly confusing, as there is no similarity whatsoever between ל and צ in regular Hebrew script (or print). Note, therefore, that the upper part of the ל in Rashi script points straight up, whereas the upper part of the צ is tilted to the right.

ט-ם These two letters are similar not only in Rashi script, but in printed texts as well. The difference between ם and ט in Ashkenazi cursive writing is the opposite of the difference between these letters in Rashi script. Note, therefore, that the ם in Rashi script is round and smooth at the bottom, while ט has a small projection on the lower left side.
